Unipart is one of only four organisations worldwide to have won both the British Safety Council's prestigious Sword of Honour and the Globe of Honour in 2014.

This is the third year in a row that Unipart has won both awards for excellence in Health and Safety and Environmental Management.

Unipart has won six Swords of Honour from the British Safety Council in 2014 for excellence in the management of health and safety.

In 2014, only 50 Swords of Honour were awarded to organisations worldwide. The six Unipart sites that won Swords of Honour were:
